## FROM THE MATCH COMMITTEE

### Lost Ball

A ball is deemed "lost" if:

- a. It is not found or identified as his by the player within five minutes after the player's side or his or their caddies have begun to search for it; or
- b. The player has made a stroke at a provisional ball from the place where the original ball is likely to be or from a point nearer the hole than that place (see Rule 27-2b); or
- c. The player has put another ball into play under penalty of stroke and distance under Rule 26-1a, 27-1 or 28a; or
- d. The player has put another ball into play because it is known or virtually certain that the ball, which has not been found, has been moved by an outside agency (see Rule 18-1), is in an obstruction (see Rule 24-3), is in an abnormal ground condition (see Rule 25-1c) or is in a water hazard (see Rule 26-1b or c); or
- e. The player has made a stroke at a substituted ball.

Time spent in playing a wrong ball is not counted in the five-minute period allowed for search.

### Ball Found After Search Exceeding Five Minutes Is Then Played

**Q.** A player searches for his ball for five minutes and does not find it. He continues to search, finds his ball and plays it. What is the ruling?

**A.** The ball was lost and therefore out of play when the five-minute period allowed for search expired - see Definitions of "Ball in Play" and "Lost Ball." When the player played a stroke with the ball out of play, he played a wrong ball - see Definition of "Wrong Ball" - and incurred a penalty of loss of hole in match play or two strokes in stroke play - Rule **15-3**. In stroke play, he was disqualified if he did not correct the

error by proceeding under Rule **27-1** before playing from the next tee - Rule **15-3b**.
